Preschool Reading Program




The Heights Foundation and their dedicated volunteers are working with Brightest Horizons Preschool age children to help prepare them for success in Kindergarten. Approximately 90% of the students enrolled in the preschool are from the Harlem Heights neighborhood, and many do not speak English in their homes. This exciting program is open to all of the Pre-K children who will be entering kindergarten in the fall.

Volunteers are needed, can you help?

- Volunteer “Reading Buddies” will work in groups of two, to provide consistency and support for one another
- Volunteer must be willing to commit at least one hour once a week (More would be even better!)
- Times are available in morning or afternoon sessions (morning preferred)
- Reading Buddies will work with small groups of up to four students
- A background in teaching or early education is not necessary. (We love teachers, but we can all be one!)

About Our Program



- Volunteers help to build early literacy skills and language ability. Letter names and sounds are emphasized along with word families
- Reading for Fun in addition to the Phonemic Awareness curriculum, Reading Buddies are needed to read to classes of preschoolers.
- Listening to language, rhythms and rhymes are important skills in developing oral vocabulary. (And it's fun!) Books from the library, or treasured children's classics, are sure to be a hit. Titles will be suggested for these reading sessions.
- Craft activities and themes allow students to use expressive language and develop their English skills.
- We are committed to supporting families of Brightest Horizons students every step of the way, and **your partnership will make us successful.**

Harlem Heights

Harlem Heights was originally settled as an agricultural community. Approximately 1,200 children live in the neighborhood. More than one in three children in Harlem Heights are living in poverty, which is a rate that is 100% greater than the county average.
